

# ABI MONTHLY REPORT<sup>1</sup> – April 2021

## (Main evidence)

### BANK LENDING PERFORMANCE

1. In March 2021, **loans to households and non-financial corporations were up yoy by +4.5%**. This result is derived from estimates based on data published by the Bank of Italy relating to loans to households and non-financial corporations (calculated including loans that have been securitised and net of variations unrelated to transactions, e.g. changes due to fluctuations in exchange rates, value adjustments or reclassification) (*cf. Table 1*).
2. In February 2021, **loans to non-financial corporations posted a 7.6% yoy increase. Loans to households were up yoy by 2.4%**.

### LENDING INTEREST RATES

3. In March 2021, **interest rates on new loans remain at particularly low levels, at record lows**, and showed the following trends (*cf. Table 2*):
  - the **average rate on total loans** fell to **2.24%** (2.25% the previous month and 6.18% prior to the onset of the crisis, at the end of 2007);
  - **the average rate on new business loans** is **1.20%** (1.15% in the previous month; 5.48% at the end of 2007);
  - **the average rate on new loans for house purchasing** is **1.37%** (1.30% in February 2021; 5.72% at the end of 2007).

### CREDIT QUALITY

4. **Net bad loans** (i.e. net of the write-downs and provisions already made by the banks with own resources) in February 2021 amounted at **20.1 billion euro, in decrease compared to 26.4 billion euro recorded in February 2020** (-6.3 billion euro equal to -23.8%) and **33.6 billion euro** recorded in February 2019 (-13.5 billion euro equal to -40.2%) (*cf. Table 3*). Compared to the highest level of net bad loans reached in November 2015 (88.8 billion), **the decline is almost 69 billion euro** (equal to -77.3%).
5. **The ratio of net bad loans to total loans stood at 1.16%** in February 2021, (it was 1.55% in February 2020, 1.95% in February 2019 and 4.89% in November 2015).

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<sup>1</sup> The ABI monthly report makes available a series of quantitative information before any other survey regarding the same data. This is possible because the banks themselves have produced this information.

## CUSTOMER FUNDING TREND

6. In Italy, in March 2021, **total funding** (deposits from resident customers and bonds) grew by **+7.1%** yoy. **Deposits** (current accounts, certificates of deposit, repurchase agreements) **increased**, in the same month, by **over 146 billion euro compared to the previous year** (an increase of +9.2%, yoy), while **medium and long term funding**, i.e. through bonds, **decreased by almost 17 billion euro** in absolute terms, over the last 12 months (equal to -7.2%). ## INTEREST RATES ON DEPOSITS

7. In March 2021, the **average interest rate on total bank funding** from customers (the sum of deposits, bonds and repurchase agreements in euro from households and non-financial corporations) **in Italy is 0.49%** (0.48% in the previous month) as a result of:
- the **rate charged on deposits** (current accounts, savings deposits and certificates of deposit), equal to **0.32%** (0.33% in the previous month);
  - the **rate on repurchase agreements**, which stands at **0.70%** (0.75% the previous month);
  - the **outstanding bond yield, equal to 1.84%** (1.87% in February 2021; cf. Table 5).

## SPREAD BETWEEN THE LENDING RATE AND DEPOSIT RATE

8. The **spread** between the average lending rate and the average rate on household and non-financial corporations funding **in Italy remains on particularly low levels, at 175 basis points**, in March 2021 (177 basis points in the previous month) showing a sharp decrease over the more than 300 basis points prior to the onset of the crisis (335 basis points at the end of 2007).
